YouthFest 2013 March 8 – 10, 2013

The following is some general information regarding the 2013 YouthFest Clinic that will be held March 8, 9 & 10th at Pats Peak Ski Area in Henniker Vermont. Other than hosting the

event a week later (by popular demand from NBS Clubs) to avoid conflicts with those that want to attend the NBS summit, most of the details remain unchanged from last years event.

Now in its fourth year, YouthFest Camp, sponsored by the Boston Ski Party, is an opportunity for youth to develop their skills in racing and skiing. The camp will include Race Training with experienced race coaches, beginner, intermediate and advanced training runs on the mountain. As in the past, members of the U.S. Race team may also assist with training more experienced racers. There will also be a range of fun youth and family oriented events both on the hill and back at our hotel. The exposure that some of the regions top racers have gotten at this event has resulted in scholarships and other high level race opportunities for our young NBS racers.

LETS KEEP SHOWCASING OUR YOUNG STARS!!!

This year's event will likely be our largest. **Space will be limited and registration may close earlier than in the past.** If you are interested you must register early. <u>Please remember that this is a gate training clinic camp designed for experienced beginner, intermediate and advanced skiers.</u> It is not a learn to ski program. While early beginners (youth and parents) are welcome, they will be required to take group lessons at there own expense as necessary. They can still register and participate in all other YouthFest activities. We expect to have approximately 60 racers from Boston and other NBS clubs.

The Camp begins the morning of Friday March 8th. If you cannot make Friday, you will still be able to participate Saturday and Sunday.

To participate, all participants must register and pay the \$50 registration fee before January 18th. After that date you will be charged a late fee. The cost of lift tickets for 3 days is approximately \$70 and for two days \$60. These tickets include a "Step up to POP Night Ticket on Saturday evening. This includes the costs of tubing as well. 2013 Black Ski Elections Are Coming April 22, 2013

Are you interested in making a difference in your ski club? Do you have leadership experience? Are you gifted in the area of administration? A Black Ski Executive Committee or Board of Directors position maybe for you!

Elected positions serve 2 years. All Vice Presidents are to have a committee. VPs should appoint an assistant to help coordinate committee activities and attend meeting in the VP's absence. The positions up for election this year are on both the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors and their primary Roles and responsibilities are as follows:

VP Administrative Support – Responsible for the administrative processing of correspondence and payments sent to the club. Specific duties:

- Picks up and distributes all mail from the P.O. Box
- Posts all payments to the payment database
- Provides weekly registers to Trip leaders and event chairs
- Hands over all checks with a copy of payment register (by activity) to the VP Finance for deposit
- Processes all returned checks per the Return Check Policy
- Notifies all Trip leaders/event chairs of returned checks

VP Advance Planning – Coordinates the planning of winter and summer club trips and most club activities. Must enjoy leading a group and work well with people and have past Black Ski Inc. trip planning experience. Specific duties:

- Training and developing Trip leaders and assistant Trip leaders
- Conducts Trip Leader and Intro Skiers Seminars
- Chairs monthly Advance Planning Committee meetings
- Develops and maintains a schedule of ski trips, other club events and maintains club Web calendar
- Appoints Trip leaders, event and cycling chairpersons
- Negotiates and signs contracts
- Attends cycling planning meetings
- Provides information for the HOT WAX newsletter, website and Hotline
- Represents the club at ski expos, happy hours, etc.

VP Communications – Responsible for public relations for the club and the management and production of the club newsletter, website and Hotline information. Specific duties:

- Collects and receives articles for the HOT WAX newsletter
- by the 16th of each month
- Prepares and edits the HOT WAX
- Delivers the HOT WAX to the printer
- Picks up the HOT WAX from the printer and distributes to the membership by the 1st of the month
- Responsible for maintenance of the Black Ski website
- Monitors the updating of the Black Ski Hot Line
- Responsible for Public Relations for the club

VP of Finance (Treasurer) – Responsible for the disbursement of checks and the maintenance of the financial accounts and records. Specific duties:

- Records and deposits all payments and expenses by project account using club designated PC financial software
- Prepares monthly reports on all bank accounts
- Records and maintains financial transactions both electronically and hard copy
- Provides monthly financial status reports to Trip leaders
- Assists the President in developing the annual budget
- Prepares monthly year to date financial tracking reports for the Executive Committee and Board of Directors
- Provides assessment of the club's financial condition at monthly Executive Committee meetings
- Prepares necessary paper records and works with the designated accountant in the preparation of federal, state and local taxes within 45 days of the close of the tax year
- Become versed with the IRS 501c7 guidelines

VP Membership – Responsible for maintaining the club's database, providing membership support, and soliciting and recruiting new members through such avenues as membership drives and happy hours. Specific duties:

- Maintains and updates the Black Ski Membership database
- Prepares Membership reports/census
- Distributes information to prospective members
- Processes membership applications and renewals
- Distributes welcome packets and membership cards
- Prepares and distributes renewal and expiration notices
- Prepares mailing labels for the Hot Wax newsletter
- Coordinates Membership Drive Happy Hours

There are also **3 Board of Directors** positions up for election. Board Member – Establishes policies to conduct the business of Black Ski Inc.

Qualifications for Executive Committee positions:

- Two consecutive years of full membership in Black Ski
- At least 18 years of age

Qualifications for the Board of Directors:

- Full membership in Black Ski for a minimum of three consecutive years.
- Administrative, business or organizational service/ experience in Black Ski for a minimum of one year.
- At least 18 years of age.
- Is not holding another elected position in Black Ski.

It Takes A Village to Support and Train An NBS Black Ski Elite Racer

With the support of the Black Ski Club, Boston Ski Party friends of Youth Enrichment Services (YES) and the National Brotherhood of Skiers (NBS); NBS Eastern Region Elite Racer Christian Kennedy has had the opportunity to enroll in Waterville Valley Ski Academy in Waterville, New Hampshire. Christian recently applied for the National Scholarship.

You might remember that Christian was the first African American to win the J-3 Pennsylvania State Championship in 2011 covering the areas of DC, MD, VA, and PA. He went on to the Junior Olympics where he placed 15th in the Slalom. He was one of two non-academy skiers to break into the top 30.

Christian's talent was spotted by Black Ski members, Beverly Broady, Gary Trotter, and our then youth director James Glover. Beverly enthusiastically encouraged Christian's family to start looking into race training academies.

Last ski season, Christian attended the YouthFest regional event hosted at Pat's Peak. There he met Boston Ski Party's Richard Ward, who introduced him to Waterville racer Darnell Holmes. Richard Ward, Darnell and Darnell's mother, strongly convinced Christian to apply to Waterville Valley Academy.

In November 2012, Christian began a full time program at Waterville. He spent most of November training at Copper Mountain in Colorado. After a two day Thanksgiving break he was back at Waterville and during December has been chasing snow training at Sunday River Maine when the weather has not cooperated at Waterville, NH. You can



follow him on livetiming.com. As well as, the NBS facebook site is regularly updated with Christian's progress.

This season, Christian has been race training ON SNOW for 8 weeks! After a short Christmas break, he returned to Waterville to train and will enter many races until April. His parents remarked that if Christian were training in Pennsylvania he would have zero ski training days before the New Year. Both Christian and his family are very grateful to Black Ski, Boston Ski Party, YES and NBS for making this dreamed opportunity come true. Thank you for your monetary support and other matching scholarships.
