Black Ski Member Proclaims: In City Swimming Pools, a Fountain of Youth

uring the summers of his youth, Bradford Tatum would cool off by splashing in the Reflecting Pool near the Lincoln Memorial. This was in the 1920s, when Tatum was about 7. Police would chase him away, but he kept coming back. When fall came and temperatures began to dip, young Brad would slip into the Potomac near Georgetown, where the river was warmed by discharge from waterfront factories. It's a wonder he didn't drown -- or at least have his skin rot off.

Tatum is still very much alive, and so is his love for swimming. Now 86, he's a member of a seniors' swim team in the District called the Water Wizards. And at the national Summer Senior Olympics in Louisville last week, he stroked his way to gold medals in the 100- and 200-yard freestyle. He also won a pair of silver medals in the 50- and 100-yard breast stroke and a bronze medal in the 50-yard freestyle.

It seems that what didn't kill him as a boy only made him stronger. "I don't have any illnesses and just recently began to take one pill a day for bone density," he told me. At the Senior Olympics, he set speed records in both freestyle competitions. He practices with his team three times a week. He taught both of his children and two grandchildren how to swim, and he swims with them whenever he can. When the family goes to the beach, he swims.

"I skied up until I was 80, but when I fell and broke my arm, I decided maybe I should just stick with swimming," he said.

Whenever a new swimming pool opens in the city, he wants to check it out. "In the last four, five years, you have all of these new pools -- five indoor pools and I can't count all of the outdoor pools," he said, sounding as excited as any 8-year-old. "They have the latest equipment, state-of-the-art stuff. It's amazing."

Tatum grew up in Foggy Bottom. His father worked for the Treasury Department, shoveling piles of worn-out paper money into a furnace; his mother was a janitor at the National Academy of Sciences. The family, which included Tatum and seven siblings, lived in a three-bedroom rowhouse. "We didn't have air conditioning, and there were no swimming pools for blacks until 1928," he recalled.

"To stay reasonably comfortable in summer, we'd sit out on the front porch, barefoot and wearing as few clothes as possible." Or he'd risk getting arrested for wading in the water on the Mall.

The first swimming facility for blacks in the city was at Francis Recreation Center at 25th and N streets NW. The

10-cent admission fee initially proved as much of an obstacle for Tatum as a "whites only" sign. Determined to learn how to swim, however, Tatum got a job at the pool, first picking up trash and later as a towel boy.

He got to meet the lifeguards and swim instructors. Among them was Charles Drew, then a medical student at Howard University. Drew would go on to international acclaim for developing a procedure for storing blood plasma. Drew's brother, Joe, also worked at the pool; he became a respected

physical education teacher and swim coach at Cardozo High.

Tatum became a schoolteacher, a principal and later an assistant D.C. superintendent for elementary schools. Despite the stresses, he's stayed active and in good health.

"No high blood pressure for me and no special diet," he said. His wife, Ann Louise, 84, does not swim. But she does cook. "I eat whatever she prepares," he said. And if he does happen to put on an extra pound or two, a few extra laps in the pool melt them right off. To hear Tatum tell it, he plans not only on swimming in more Senior Olympic games but on stroking for years to come in the stream of life.



Effective 9/1/00 Anyone going on a weekend or longer trip must be a club member.

An initial deposit per person is required to confirm your reservation. A non-refundable deposit fee of \$50 will be assessed if cancellation is received after date specified on trip flyer.

PAYMENTS

The payment schedule outlined on trip flyer must be adhered to unless arrangements are made with the Trip Directors. Failure to receive payment by date specified may cause loss of reservation (see cancellation for non-payment below). Monies received within thirty (30) days of the trip date will only be accepted in the form of a money order, certified check or cashier's check. No cash or personal check transactions will be accepted.

CANCELLATION

(a) Request for cancellation: A request to cancel from a trip must be in writing and directed to the Trip Director. The participant by voluntarily requesting to be canceled from the trip will be assessed the non-refundable deposit fee (as specified on trip flyer) plus any payments that have been made to vendors on his/her behalf.
