Black Ski Youth Moving Forward

he BSI Youth Program has made significant progress over the last several years. Just five years ago there were three (3) youth signed up for the youth program. These youth were taken to the mountain as part of the day trips put on by the club. The year was 2006.



During the year of 2007, ten (10) youth joined the youth program and we were able to establish (4)formal four training sessions in collaboration with Liberty Mountain who provided certified ski

instructors. These sessions were held on Sunday. Youth were divided by skill level (Intermediate Beginner, Intermediate, and Advance).

The next year (2008) the number of youth who joined the program increased to seventeen (17). Within this number we

were able to get one (1) youth member on the Liberty Mountain Race Team (LMRT). LMRT is a certified USSA race program managed by certified race coaches. The program is designed to provide race training skills and techniques. In addition, we were able to attract three (3) snowboarders. The Mountain had to bring on more instructors particularly since we now had a large development team and snowboarders as well.

In the year 2009 total youth enrollment

climbed to twenty five (25) clearly indicating that our program was taking off in a positive way. At this point we had five (5) youth who were considered our advance skiers. They had mastered most of Liberty Mountain and needed new challenges. So we had them tryout for the Liberty Mountain Race Team. All five youth were accepted on the team. In addition to the racers, the registration of the snowboarders had increased to five (5). Lastly, some of our youth were introduced to the Mountain's Saturday Program where they could also get an introduction to "Racing".

In 2010 with a little recruitment effort, youth registration soared to forty five (45). Within this number, we had four (4) racers who competed against race clubs from other Pennsylvania Mountains. Also, the snowboarders increased their numbers to seven (7). For the development team we increased the number of training sessions from four (4) to six (6). One other accomplishment was the fact that we successfully convinced Liberty Mountain to lower the minimum age from eight (8)

to six (6). This allowed us to recruit youth ranging from 6 to 17 with skill levels that ranged from beginner to advance. The Saturday program attracted more youth who were interested in learning racing techniques.



The 2011 season was marked with declining enrollment. Youth registration had dropped to 37. This was due in part to climbing unemployment and related financial challenges. However, we did not let this stop us. The number of racers increased to eight (8) and the number of snowboarders held steady at seven (7). Our advance racers had competed on more steep and difficult mountains. Finally, some of the BSI Development Team members have elected to double their training week sessions from four (4) to eight (8). This is definitely an indication of how excited the youth are about skiing and snowboarding.

The youth program has picked up a tremendous amount of momentum. Training for the racers starts in the middle of December and ends the middle of March. Training takes place

on Saturday and Sunday. The LMRT also offers a training camp before the season starts (early December) in Vermont and another ski camp during the Christmas holiday. For the BSI Development Team which includes snowboarders, training starts the beginning of January and ends early March.

During the ski season we normally invite the youth to the Eastern Regional Ski Trip called Winterfest. The purpose of this trip is to introduce our youth to a larger mountain with more difficult

trails and challenging terrain. This trip is usually held in New Hampshire, Vermont or Maine.

Over the last three years we also introduced another trip in New Hampshire called Youthfest. This is an invitational trip facilitated by the Boston Ski Party. The mountain is called Pats Peak. The youth that attend this trip also get ski instruction, introduced to professional skiers, USSA Olympic caliber racers, and attend clinics on how to care for ski equipment. More importantly, it's a great deal of fun.

All in all, a lot has been a c c o m p l i s h e d throughout the years, and a lot is yet to come.



FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

40th Anniversary Celebration...Celebrating Our Past...Moving into Our Future

On Saturday, August 18, 2012 our 40th anniversary was celebrated in GRAND style at the Renaissance Mayflower Hotel. In a period of less than 8 weeks our awesome anniversary committee, led by Shirley France, pulled together to sell and distribute more than 240 tickets online, at meetings and other places, and through the mail. How to Train for a Century Bike Race

In sports, as in life, the challenges always lie in the next step up. If you enjoy cycling, you might first go faster, then go longer and then end up staring at a century ride race registration form with a bewildered look on your face. But, take heed, because according to Edmund Burke, author of "The Complete Book of Long-Distance Cycling," if you are able "to average 35 miles every other day for several months," then you're ready for your first century ride.

Step 1

Build your base by gradually increasing your daily and weekly mileage. The rule of thumb of exercise increase is no more than 5 percent per week. If you are riding 10 miles at a time, add about half a mile per week to that in this base-building period. If you are already inching up to the 20 mile mark each ride, increase your ride by 1 mile.

Step 2

Increase your intensity each week. As your body naturally adjusts to your weekly mileage increases, it will be time to begin amping up your intensity level. Adding a speed session to your training regimen or challenging yourself on a hilly course every two weeks will keep your body from getting complacent with long, slow distance at the same speed and intensity day in and day out.

Step 3

Slow your pace down and ride on a flat, easy course one week a month. Lance Armstrong and Chris Carmichael, co-authors of "The Lance Armstrong Performance Program," recommend that these recovery rides be performed at 60 percent to 65 percent of your maximum heart rate.

To calculate your maximum heart rate, subtract your age from 220. For instance, a 32-year-old would have a maximum

heart rate of 188 beats per minute. Multiply 188 by 0.6 and you have calculated that 60 percent of this 32-year-old's maximum heart rate is 113 beats per minute. For the 32-year-old, the week of recovery rides will be performed slow enough to keep the heart rate beating in the 113 to 122 range. From those examples, you can calculate your own target for beats per minute.



Step 4

Get plenty of rest throughout your training and eat clean foods in order to fuel your workouts. Cycling is a sport for fueling on the go because you can continuously drink from a water bottle and eat bars and other quick snacks. The authors of "The Performance Zone" recommend that in training and on race day you should "drink at approximately the same rate as you sweat." Keep the water and electrolyte-enhancing drinks flowing continually, particularly in warmer weather.

Step 5

Train at your pace. Unless you are ultra-competitive, the point of your first century ride is to prove to yourself that you can go the distance. Enjoy the journey as well as the goal.

Tips and Warnings

- Padding cycling shorts are also highly recommended at this distance. You don't have to have them in order to ride, but your buttocks will thank you for them.
- Consult your family doctor to ensure you are in good enough health for this undertaking.

Effective 9/1/00 Anyone going on a weekend or longer trip must be a club member.

An initial deposit per person is required to confirm your reservation. A non-refundable deposit fee of up to \$250 will be assessed if cancellation is received after date specified on trip flyer.

PAYMENTS

The payment schedule outlined on trip flyer must be adhered to unless arrangements are made with the Trip Directors. Failure to receive payment by date specified may cause loss of reservation (see cancellation for non-payment below).
